

Innsbruck University and MIOS, ZRS collaboration on water research in the Anthropocene



Between 14 and 18 July, Dr Shé Hawke the Head of MIOS travelled to Innsbruck, Austria to begin filming waterscapes with her Asutrian counterpart Dr Reingard Spannring, that will be part of the Aqua App they are designing. This is part of the Anthropocene Project (ARRS J7-1824) that brought Dr Hawke and her inter disciplinary approach here to ZRS from Australia last November. The research process is co-evolving very well. Along with designing the App and taking some wonderful shots of nature, in particular water, Drs Hawke and Spannring have been busy writing scientific articles in which they will report on their research. In September, Dr Hawke will again visit Innsbruck to complete the initial stages of the App development with Dr Spannring and a local film maker.
